

TECHNICAL BREAKOUT SESSIONS

Ethics—Common Construction Issues (1 PDH)

Mitch Olson and Dave McCormack, Axley Brynelson LLP

Paving companies face numerous legal challenges when bidding, contracting and performing pavement projects. Pavers are also vulnerable to contractual, regulatory and civil claims. Attorneys Mitch Olson and Dave McCormack have in-depth experience representing paving companies and will share some common legal issues facing asphalt pavers and strategies for avoiding liability.

Asphalt Paver Best Practices (1 PDH)

Dave King, Caterpillar, Inc.

An asphalt paver's primary function is to lay the mat at the specified width and thickness. Achieving this accurately requires more than pressing a button; it depends on crew members who understand and apply best practices to ensure the mat is placed correctly. This session will cover essential techniques to help your crews achieve consistent results in creating a smooth, stable mat. This session will close with a brief overview of the new SDX screed plate technology upon request.

WisDOT Work Zone Planning and Design (1 PDH)

Andy Heidtke and Joe Schneider, WisDOT Bureau of Traffic Operations

This session will cover how WisDOT develops temporary traffic control plans. We will discuss tools and processes such as the Work Zone Impact Assessments, the Work Zone Traffic Analysis Tool, and the Transportation Management Plans used in developing the plans and specifications.



Planning, Design and Construction Overview (1 PDH)

Tony Barth, Rielly O'Donnell, Brian Boothby and Erik Lyngdal, WisDOT Systems Planning/Bureau of Project Development/Technical Services Section

This session will discuss the planning process from concept to design, the process of handling questions that come in to Bidx, and common construction/materials issues on WisDOT projects.

BTS Update (1 PDH)

Casey Wierzchowski and Dan Kopacz, WisDOT Bureau of Technical Services, HMA Unit

An update will be provided on WisDOT's timelines for implementation of AASHTOWare and associated specification updates including Percent Within Limits, small tonnages, and lessons learned. Information will be shared on WisDOT's progress regarding Balanced Mix Designs and current research.

Implementation of Low Carbon Transportation Materials (LCTM) Program (1 PDH)

Myungook (MK) Kang and Linette Rizos, WisDOT Bureau of Technical Services, Quality Assurance Unit

WisDOT has received federal funding to create a Low-Carbon Transportation Materials (LCTM) program for WisDOT. The program encourages state DOTs and contractors to increase the use of LCTM on federal-aid projects. Funding from the grant will help WisDOT establish the framework to administer the LCTM program and incentivize contractors to reduce the embodied carbon consumption of HMA. This session covers WisDOT's goals, eligible activities, and expected benefits for agencies and contractors.

GENERAL SESSION SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Kristina Boardman

In September 2024, Governor Tony Evers appointed Kristina Boardman to serve as Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT). WisDOT is one of the largest state agencies, with more than 3,200 employees and a biennial budget of more than \$8 billion.

Kristina's public service career began with the Wisconsin State Assembly in 1995. She transitioned to WisDOT in 2005 and held previous positions including Deputy Secretary, DMV Administrator, DMV Deputy Administrator, and the Director of DMV Field Services.

Kristina enjoys both policy and operations work, and especially appreciates the rewarding work of serving the public through the implementation of new programs.

Kristina plays an active role at the regional and national levels and served as Chair of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA) International Board of Directors, as a member of the AASHTO Board of Directors and currently as the Chair of the AASHTO Committee on Safety.

Kristina has a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois. Kristina and her husband live in Sun Prairie and have two adult children.

James Pforr

James is a registered Professional Engineer. He joined the FHWA Wisconsin Division in 2020 and currently serves as the Program Improvement Manager while also managing the pavement, materials, and asset management programs. Prior to his time with FHWA, he worked for two years as a consultant asphalt materials engineer at

the WisDOT Bureau of Technical Services
Truax Lab. For five years he was a consultant
pavement engineer for a variety of clients
including state DOTs, the Department of
Defense, commercial airports, and statewide bureaus of aeronautics. He also
worked as a research engineer at the Illinois
Center for Transportation for two years after
finishing his undergraduate and master's
degree in civil engineering at the University
of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. He lives near
Madison with his wife and two children and
enjoys hiking, biking, and playing guitar.

Ram Veeraragan

Dr. Ram Kumar Veeraragavan is a Project Engineer with the Federal Highway Administration's Mobile Asphalt Technology Center (MATC), where he leads advancements in asphalt materials. performance-based testing, and technology transfer. With over a decade of experience in pavement engineering, his work spans sustainable road infrastructure design, nondestructive evaluation methods, and balanced mix design approaches. He has participated in conferences for knowledge dissemination to DOT personnel, helped fine-tune test protocols and quality assurance procedures through specification reviews, and provided technical support to national research initiatives on testing and use of new materials for improved performance of road infrastructure. Dr. Veeraragavan holds a Ph.D. in Civil Engineering from Worcester Polytechnic Institute.

Vince Hafeli

Dr. Vince Hafeli, D.B.A., is President of Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, a leading asphalt paving and construction services provider. His Doctoral research at the University of South Florida focused on the critical issue of suicide in the construction industry, highlighting his commitment to addressing mental health challenges in this sector.

As an international speaker, author, and dedicated mental health advocate, Vince is passionate about raising awareness and reducing the stigma of mental illness. His deep understanding of individuals' mental health challenges has made him a prominent voice in the advocacy community. 
