Investing in long-life pavements will provide long-term benefits on joint project

Madison – The Wisconsin Asphalt Pavement Association (WAPA) awarded the Village of Weston and the Village of Rothschild with the 2024 Local Asphalt Award, for their work to advance innovation in asphalt pavements.
